AMERICAS PORT SITUATION UPDATE

PORT CONDITIONS – CANADA (1/4)

28th March 2024

VANCOUVER

- Vessel schedule has been impacted seriously due to imbalance between rail car supply and import rail volume along with the backlogs, 14 days and over on dock dwell in recent 30 days. Rail loading delay out of Delta port and Centerm due to backlog of import volume and short of car supply. -Yard is congested with high on-dock ground count while rail car supply can't meet the demand.
- Rail car short due to cold snap in inland network in wk11. Terminal is pushing more train plans in wk12/13.

PRINCE RUPERT

-1.1% of IPI volume had 11 days on dock dwell in the recent 30 days. Terminal
encourages steamship lines to evaluate and act on any remediation plan, such as
diverting cargos to CAPRR, converting rail cargos to truck out.

PORT CONDITIONS – CANADA (2/4)

28th March 2024

HALIFAX

- Please note that the truck gates at PSA Halifax Atlantic Hub and Fairview Cove terminals will be closed on Friday, March 29 (Good Friday). The gates will be open on Monday, April 1, 2024.
- Vessels are arriving in Halifax with minimal delays. Import rail dwell is presently around 4.20 days at PSA Halifax Fairview Cove and 1.70 days PSA Halifax Atlantic Hub.





PORT CONDITIONS – CANADA (3/4)

MONTREAL

- Potential Strike at Port of Montreal update: The dock workers at Canada's second-busiest port
 have been without a labor deal since their agreement expired on December 31. The Maritime
 Employers Association (MEA) in Montreal, which employs approximately 1,290 longshore
 workers and 165 checkers, has been in negotiations with union representatives. Several
 mediation meetings, including some this month, have taken place in an effort to reach a new
 collective agreement.
- Experts from the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service are actively participating in these discussions. All parties are to get back to mediation as of April 1st for now Business as Usual

SAINT JOHN (CASJB)

• Current Import rail dwell time above average of 4.2 days, no issues weather related

TORONTO AREA TERMINALS

• The trucking capacity in the Toronto marketplace has significantly improved, resulting in an increase in truckers' yard capacity. As a result, the waiting time at the terminal is returning to normal levels. However, we are observing significant waiting time at terminal for few containers specially at CP Vaughan rail terminal. RV issues are still a problem at CN Brampton, leading to delays in transporting export shipments from Toronto (for certain S/S lines that utilize CN in Toronto).

PORT CONDITIONS – USA (1/4)

28th March 2024

SEATTLE/ TACOMA

- No waiting times at Husky and up to 3 days at Washington United terminal at Tacoma. Upto 2 days waiting time at Seattle.
- Import rail dwell are 1.6 days at Husky, 1.4 days at Washington United Terminal and 1-3 days at T18.
- The average gate turn times are as follows: 30 minutes for T18, 39 minutes for Washington United Terminal, and 56 minutes for Husky.
- Terminal 18 will be closed Fridays through March and April 1, 2024.

OAKLAND

- Average wait time of up to 4 days at Oakland Int'l Container Terminal (OICT) and 1 day at TraPac.
- Average import deliveries can take up to 4 days at TraPac and 4 days at OICT.
- Average gate turn times are 64 / 72 minutes for OICT and TraPac respectively.
- OICT Berth 55 is operational. Hoot shifts are being worked to help alleviate the backlog of vessels waiting for berthing.





PORT CONDITIONS – USA (2/4)

LOS
ANGELES/
LONG
BEACH

- Port of Los Angeles dwell times for local import cargo is 3.2 days, on-dock rail dwell is 5.8 days and import units on street is averaging at 3.8 / 5.3 days for 20 ft and 40+ ft containers respectively.
- Port of Long Beach dwell times for local imports are stable and average terminal gate turn time is between 22-100 minutes, depending on the terminal.

HOUSTON

- Up to 3 days waiting time for vessel berthing at Barbours Cut terminal and 3 days at Bayport Container Terminal.
- Bad weather in the Gulf of Mexico continues to cause closures at ports south of Houston and delays on arrival, on short notice.
- Average gate turn times at Barbours Cut Container Terminal are 34 / 51 minutes at Bayport Container Terminal.
- Loaded import dwell is at 3.6 days.

PORT CONDITIONS – USA (3/4)

28th March 2024

SAVANNAH

- Waiting time for vessel berth at the terminal is up to 4 days, depending on the size of the vessel.
- Frequent river closures are expected due to fog during this week.
- Average gate turn times are 34 / 49 minutes for single and double transactions respectively.
- Import dwell time is at 4.9 days

CHARLESTON

- Waiting time for vessel berthing is 1 day at Wando Welch Terminal and 0.5 days at North Charleston Terminal.
- Average truck turn times are 19 / 20 minutes at Wando Welch Terminal and North Charleston Terminal respectively.
- Dock construction at Wando Welch terminal is starting in March 2024, reducing from 3 to 2 berths for one year. Berths will be given on first come, first serve basis. This project will also limit the amount of class 1.1 and 1.2 that can be handled at the terminal during this time.
- Sunday gates are by appointment only

NORFOLK

- Currently, most vessels berth on arrival, however, the bigger vessels wait approx. 2 days for a berth.
- Average gate turn times are 37 / 51 minutes for single and double transactions respectively.
- Berth congestion has eased overall.





PORT CONDITIONS – USA (4/4)

MIAMI/PORT EVERGLADES

Vessel waiting time up to 3 days.

NEW YORK

- No waiting time expected for berth at Maher Terminals LLC and APM Terminals. A 3-day waiting time at Port Liberty Terminal Bayonne can be expected.
- Average gate turn times are 45 / 68 minutes for single and double transactions respectively.
- APMT will not have a gate open on Saturdays

- Same issue as before. Carriers only provide priority to Reefer cargo; they are not moving too much via FFWW. Carriers are prioritizing allocation for Dry cargo to move their own biz (Direct BL with final customer).
- Lack of empty equipment in PAI.

Port just with direct service and previous DGF VE approval.

- No acceptance of cargo to this port now.
- DGF VE stop of operations temporarily.

PORT CONDITIONS - MEXICO (1/2)

28th March 2024

LÁZARO CARDENAS

- Operation delays due to congestion at port.
- Lack of equipment due to an increase in demand (reflection of ZLO congestion); estimated time for transport assignment is 5 to 7 days.
- Lack of trucking availability.

ENSENADA

- Port is operating at 90 to 99% of capacity, the containers can only enter to the port prior 2 days the ETA of the vessel due to no space for maintaining the containers at the yards.
- Lack of trucking availability.

MANZANILLO

- Congestion is presented in terminals
- Lack of equipment for this corridors, forecast is mandatory.
- Vessels are facing arrival delays. ETD is changing constantly.
